## MINOR IN ASIAN AMERICAN STUDIES

The Asian American Studies Institute at UConn offers an interdisciplinary Minor in Asian American Studies.

Students are required to complete eighteen credits at a C (2.0) or better in each of the required courses at the 3000-level in Sections A, B, C, and D:

Three credits from Section A: AASI 3201.

Six credits from Section B: AASI 3215, 3295, 4999; AASI/ARTH 3220; AASI/ENGL 3212; AASI/HIST 3531, 3578; AASI/HRTS/SOCI 3221;

Six credits from Section C: AASI 3214, 3216, 3295, 4999; AASI/HRTS/SOCI 3222; AASI/HIST 3812, 3808, 3809; HIST 3822; POLS 3472; and

Three credits from Section D: AFAM/ENGL 3214W; AFAM/HIST/HRTS 3563; ANTH/PRLS 3241; AFAM/HRTS/SOCI 3825, 3505; COMM/PRLS 4320; DRAM 3131; AFAM/HIST 3564; HIST/WS 3562; PRLS 3298.

Additionally with the approval of the Minor Advisor, a three-credit independent study course with substantial Asian American or Asian content may also be counted towards the minor in lieu of a course in either Section B or C.
