

FRED HO PRIZE / ASIAN AMERICAN HISTORY AND CULTURE

The Asian American Studies Institute at the University of Connecticut seeks applicants for the Fred Ho Prize in Asian American History and Culture.

\$500 will be awarded to an undergraduate student project that best integrates the material in the Fred Ho Special Collection housed in the Thomas J. Dodd Research Center. Applicants are encouraged to take creative approaches in their consideration of the archive, and projects can take the form of visual, artistic, and musical production. The contest is open to all University of Connecticut undergraduate students, regardless of major, semester standing or prior knowledge of Asian American Studies.

The Fred Ho Collection contains articles, poetry, music, critical reviews, and speeches written and collected by Fred Ho. These materials offer insight into the development of an Asian American artist and activist, and illustrate aspects of contemporary Asian American history and culture.

Applicants are required to visit the archive to conduct primary research as part of the contest.



CONTEST REQUIREMENTS

- Include an abstract or statement referencing the collection with your submission.
- Final projects must be received by 3:00 p.m. on March 31, 2009.

The winner will be notified at the end of the Spring Semester.
